


The First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. 


The Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31
