Some suggestions for using this home worship kit:

- Choose a time for worship that works for you and/or your family. It doesn't have to be the same time as our online worship; it just needs to be convenient for you.
- Look through the liturgies before you begin. They aren't complicated, but you will need to decide who will lead (who will be the "Leader") and who will do the readings. For those unable to join us online, there are meditations for each day.
- If you have children, try to incorporate them into the liturgy in as many ways as
 possible. They can do readings, carry the branches on Palm Sunday, or set the
 table for Maundy Thursday. We've also put together some coloring pages for
 each liturgy that can be printed out for the kids (and maybe the grownups) in
 your family.
- Choose a place where you'll have your worship each day. This may be the same place all week, or you may choose to move your worship depending on the pattern of the worship. Try to create a space that looks special, a little different from the rest of your home. Bring a candle to light for worship (we sent one home!), bring your Bibles and crosses and anything else that speaks to you of God.
- Enjoy! These liturgies are for you, to bring you and your family into the presence of God. Make them your own, and don't worry if you have to stop or if you make a mistake. God will still bless your gathering and hear your prayers

The Gospel Mark 11:1-11

Reader

Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it." So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" They said, "The Lord needs it." Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."



NARRATOR: The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Mark.

As soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council. They bound Jesus, led him away,

and handed him over to Pilate. Pilate asked him,

PILATE: "Are you the King of the Jews?"

NARRATOR: He answered him,

JESUS: "You say so."

NARRATOR: Then the chief priests accused him of many things. Pilate asked him again

PILATE: "Have you no answer? See how many charges they bring against you."

NARRATOR: But Jesus made no further reply, so that Pilate was amazed. Now at the

festival he used to release a prisoner for them, anyone for whom they asked. Now a man called Barabbas was in prison with the rebels who had committed murder during the insurrection. So the crowd came and began to ask Pilate to do for them according to his custom. Then he answered

them,

PILATE: "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?"

NARRATOR: For he realized that it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had handed

him over. But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release

Barabbas for them instead. Pilate spoke to them again,

PILATE: "Then what do you wish me to do with the man you call the King of the

Jews?"

NARRATOR: They shouted back,

ALL: "Crucify him!"

NARRATOR: Pilate asked them,

PILATE: "Why, what evil has he done?"

NARRATOR: But they shouted all the more,

ALL: "Crucify him!"

NARRATOR: So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas for them; and

after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be crucified. Then the soldiers led him into the courtyard of the palace (that is, the governor's headquarters); and they called together the whole cohort. And they clothed him in a purple cloak; and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put

it on him. And they began saluting him,

ALL: "Hail, King of the Jews!"

NARRATOR: They struck his head with a reed, spat upon him, and knelt down in homage

to him. After mocking him, they stripped him of the purple cloak and put his

own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him.

(At the mention of Golgotha, all stand in body or in spirit.)

NARRATOR: They compelled a passer-by, who was coming in from the country, to carry

his cross; it was Simon of Cyrene, the father of Alexander and Rufus. Then

they brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means the place of a skull). And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh; but he did not take it. And they crucified him, and divided his clothes among them, casting lots to decide what each should take. It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him. The inscription of the charge against him read, "The King of the Jews." And with him they crucified two bandits, one on his right and one on his left. Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads and saying,

ALL: "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save

yourself, and come down from the cross!"

NARRATOR: In the same way the chief priests, along with the scribes, were also mocking

him among themselves and saying,

ALL: "He saved others; he cannot save himself. Let the Messiah, the King of

Israel, come down from the cross now, so that we may see and believe."

NARRATOR: Those who were crucified with him also taunted him. When it was noon,

darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. At three

o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice,

JESUS: "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?"

NARRATOR: which means,

JESUS: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

NARRATOR: When some of the bystanders heard it, they said,

ALL: "Listen, he is calling for Elijah."

NARRATOR: And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave

it to him to drink, saying,

ALL: "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down."

NARRATOR: Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the

temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. Now when the centurion, who

stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said.

CENTURION: "Truly this man was God's Son!"

NARRATOR: There were also women looking on from a distance; among them were Mary

Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and Salome. These used to follow him and provided for him when he was in Galilee; and there were many other women who had come up with him to Jerusalem. When evening had come, and since it was the day of Preparation, that is, the day before the sabbath, Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself waiting expectantly for the kingdom of God, went boldly to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate wondered if he were already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him whether he had been dead for some time. When he learned from the centurion that he was dead, he granted the body to Joseph. Then Joseph bought a linen cloth, and taking down the body, wrapped it in the linen cloth, and laid it in a tomb that had been hewn out of the rock. He then rolled a stone against the door of the tomb. Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses saw where the body was laid.



Lesson 4 A Reading from the Treatise of Saint Augustine the Bishop on the Psalms.

(Vulgate Psalm 54. Prayer Book Psalm 55:1,2,10c)

"Hear my prayer, O God; do not hide yourself from my petition. Listen to me and answer me. I mourn in my trial and am troubled." These are the words of one disquieted, in trouble and anxiety. He prays under much suffering, desiring to be delivered from evil. Let us now see under what evil he lies; and when he begins to speak, let us place ourselves beside him, that, by sharing his tribulation, we may also join in his prayer. "I mourn in my trial," he says, "and am troubled." When does he mourn? When is he troubled? He says, "In my trial." He has in mind the wicked who cause him suffering, and he calls this suffering his "trial." Do not think that the evil are in the world for no purpose, and that God makes no good use of them. Every wicked person lives either that he may be corrected, or that through him the righteous may be tried and tested.

Would that those who now test us were converted and tried with us; yet though they continue to try us, let us not hate them, for we do not know whether any of them will persist to the end in their evil ways. And most of the time, when you think you are hating your enemy, you are hating your brother without knowing it. Only the devil and his angels are shown to us in the Holy Scriptures as doomed to eternal fire. It is only their amendment that is hopeless, and against them we wage a hidden battle. For this battle the Apostle arms us, saying, "We are not contending against flesh and blood," that is, not against human beings whom we see, "but against the principalities, against the powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world." So that you may not think that demons are the rulers of heaven and earth, he says, "of the darkness of this world." He says, "of the world," meaning the lovers of the world— of the "world," meaning the ungodly and wicked—the "world" of which the Gospel says, "And the world knew him not."

Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. Maundy Thursday An Agape Meal



A Note About Tonight's Liturgy

This worship for Maundy Thursday is an Agape Meal to be shared in the family home. Some members of the congregation may also join together in worship on Zoom at 6:00 pm. **Zoom Meeting ID: 99011973682**

Agape is a Greek word meaning "love"—a particular kind of love, separate from romantic love or love of self. Agape is the highest, holiest kind of love, the love that is born of God and revealed most fully in the person of Jesus Christ. When Jesus shared Passover with his

disciples, it was in the home tradition and setting of the Passover meal. The washing of feet, the sharing of bread and wine, and the new commandment to love one another all happened in a home, in a room where Jesus drew his friends together as host, teacher, friend, and master who was there to serve them all.

This meal is not Holy Communion, but it reminds us how every common meal, every act of table fellowship, contains echoes of the Lord's Supper, that great and wondrous Sacrament that we know we will enjoy together again once this time of sacrificial love is past.

Here are some things to prepare your home for the service:

- 1. **Prepare a simple meal** to share in your home. A Mediterranean style meal is often chosen for Agape Meals, but any foods are fine as long as they are simple. Salads, soups, simple proteins, fruits and nuts, and simple grains or pastas can all be fine. Include a bit of bread and wine (or juice), according to what is in keeping with your dietary requirements and personal choices.
- 2. **Set your table with your meal,** and **bring this leaflet with you**. Bring your candles from your home worship space or set up others and light them before the meal.
- 3. If several people are present, choose one person to be the Leader and others to do the readings.

Note: If you are joining with others from CHT on the Zoom conversation:

- a. Set your space for your meal with a laptop, tablet, cell phone, or internetconnected screen in the room where it can be visible to everyone during the meal.
- b. Make sure your device is connected to the internet and join just before 6.

The Meal

The Word and the Prayers

As the meal is ending, read the following from the Gospel of John. This is often called the High Priestly Prayer, the final prayer Jesus offers for his disciples before his arrest and crucifixion.

- Reader 1: Jesus looked up to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do. So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed.
- I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them.
- And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world.
- Reader 4: Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth. I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. The Passion Narrative:

John 18:1-19:42

NARRATOR:

The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. Jesus went out with his disciples across the Kidron valley to a place where there was a garden, which he and his disciples entered. Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place, because Jesus often met there with his disciples. So Judas brought a detachment of soldiers together with police from the chief priests and the Pharisees, and they came there with lanterns and torches and weapons. Then Jesus, knowing all that was to happen to him, came forward and asked them,

JESUS: "Whom are you looking for?"

NARRATOR: They answered,

ALL: "Jesus of Nazareth."

NARRATOR: Jesus replied, JESUS: "I am he."

NARRATOR: Judas, who betrayed him, was standing with them. When Jesus said to them,

"I am he." they stepped back and fell to the ground. Again he asked them.

JESUS: "Whom are you looking for?"

NARRATOR: And they said,

ALL: "Jesus of Nazareth." NARRATOR: Jesus answered,

JESUS: "I told you that I am he. So if you are looking for me, let these men go."

NARRATOR: This was to fulfill the word that he had spoken, "I did not lose a single one of

those whom you gave me." Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it, struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right ear. The slave's name was Malchus.

Jesus said to Peter,

JESUS: "Put your sword back into its sheath. Am I not to drink the cup that the Father

has given me?"

NARRATOR: So the soldiers, their officer, and the Jewish police arrested Jesus and bound

him. First they took him to Annas, who was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, the high priest that year. Caiaphas was the one who had advised the Jews that it

was better to have one person die for the people.

Simon Peter and another disciple followed Jesus. Since that disciple was known to the high priest, he went with Jesus into the courtyard of the high priest, but Peter was standing outside at the gate. So the other disciple, who was known to the high priest, went out, spoke to the woman who guarded the gate, and

brought Peter in. The woman said to Peter,

ALL: "You are not also one of this man's disciples, are you?"

NARRATOR: He said, PETER: "I am not."

NARRATOR: Now the slaves and the police had made a charcoal fire because it was cold,

and they were standing around it and warming themselves. Peter also was

standing with them and warming himself.

Then the high priest questioned Jesus about his disciples and about his

teaching. Jesus answered,

JESUS: "I have spoken openly to the world; I have always taught in synagogues and in

the temple, where all the Jews come together. I have said nothing in secret. Why do you ask me? Ask those who heard what I said to them; they know what

I said."

NARRATOR: When he had said this, one of the police standing nearby struck Jesus on the

face, saying,

ALL: "Is that how you answer the high priest?"

NARRATOR: Jesus answered,

JESUS: "If I have spoken wrongly, testify to the wrong. But if I have spoken rightly, why

do you strike me?"

NARRATOR: Then Annas sent him bound to Caiaphas the high priest.

Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. They asked him,

ALL: "You are not also one of his disciples, are you?"

NARRATOR: He denied it and said,

PETER: "I am not."

NARRATOR: One of the slaves of the high priest, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had

cut off, asked.

ALL: "Did I not see you in the garden with him?"

NARRATOR: Again Peter denied it, and at that moment the cock crowed.

Then they took Jesus from Caiaphas to Pilate's headquarters. It was early in the morning. They themselves did not enter the headquarters, so as to avoid ritual defilement and to be able to eat the Passover. So Pilate went out to them and

said,

PILATE: "What accusation do you bring against this man?"

NARRATOR: They answered,

ALL: "If this man were not a criminal, we would not have handed him over to you."

NARRATOR: Pilate said to them,

PILATE: "Take him yourselves and judge him according to your law."

NARRATOR: The Jews replied,

ALL: "We are not permitted to put anyone to death."

NARRATOR: (This was to fulfill what Jesus had said when he indicated the kind of death he

was to die.)

Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him,

PILATE: "Are you the King of the Jews?"

NARRATOR: Jesus answered,

JESUS: "Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?"

NARRATOR: Pilate replied,

PILATE: "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you

over to me. What have you done?"

NARRATOR: Jesus answered,

JESUS: "My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my

followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews.

But as it is, my kingdom is not from here."

NARRATOR: Pilate asked him,
PILATE: "So you are a king?"
NARRATOR: Jesus answered.

JESUS: "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world,

to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

NARRATOR: Pilate asked him, PILATE: "What is truth?"

NARRATOR: After he had said this, he went out to the Jews again and told them,

PILATE: "I find no case against him. But you have a custom that I release someone for

you at the Passover. Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?"

NARRATOR: They shouted in reply,

ALL: "Not this man, but Barabbas!"

NARRATOR: Now Barabbas was a bandit.

Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they dressed him in a purple robe. They kept

coming up to him, saying,

ALL: "Hail, King of the Jews!"

NARRATOR: and striking him on the face. Pilate went out again and said to them,

PILATE: "Look, I am bringing him out to you to let you know that I find no case against

him."

NARRATOR: So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate

said to them,

PILATE: "Here is the man!"

NARRATOR: When the chief priests and the police saw him, they shouted,

ALL: "Crucify him! Crucify him!"

NARRATOR: Pilate said to them,

PILATE: "Take him yourselves and crucify him; I find no case against him."

NARRATOR: The Jews answered him,

ALL: "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has

claimed to be the Son of God."

NARRATOR: Now when Pilate heard this, he was more afraid than ever. He entered his

headquarters again and asked Jesus,

PILATE: "Where are you from?"

NARRATOR: But Jesus gave him no answer. Pilate therefore said to him,

PILATE: "Do you refuse to speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to release

you, and power to crucify you?"

NARRATOR: Jesus answered him,

JESUS: "You would have no power over me unless it had been given you from above;

therefore the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin."

NARRATOR: From then on Pilate tried to release him, but the Jews cried out,

ALL: If you release this man, you are no friend of the emperor. Everyone who

claims to be a king sets himself against the emperor."

NARRATOR: When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus outside and sat on the

judge's bench at a place called The Stone Pavement, or in Hebrew Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation for the Passover; and it was about noon. He

said to the Jews,

PILATE: "Here is your King!" NARRATOR: They cried out,

ALL: "Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!"

NARRATOR: Pilate asked them,

PILATE: "Shall I crucify your King?" NARRATOR: The chief priests answered,

ALL: "We have no king but the emperor."

NARRATOR: Then he handed him over to them to be crucified.

NARRATOR: So they took Jesus; and carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is

called The Place of the Skull, which in Hebrew is called Golgotha.

(At the mention of Golgotha, all stand as able.)

NARRATOR: There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus

between them. Pilate also had an inscription written and put on the cross. It read, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." Many of the Jews read this inscription, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, in Latin, and in Greek. Then the chief priests of the

Jews said to Pilate.

ALL: "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but, 'This man said, I am King of the

Jews.'"

NARRATOR: Pilate answered,

PILATE: "What I have written I have written."

NARRATOR: When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them

into four parts, one for each soldier. They also took his tunic; now the tunic was

seamless, woven in one piece from the top. So they said to one another,

ALL: "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see who will get it."

NARRATOR: This was to fulfill what the scripture says, "They divided my clothes among

themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots." And that is what the soldiers did. Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his

mother,

JESUS: "Woman, here is your son." NARRATOR: Then he said to the disciple,

JESUS: "Here is your mother."

NARRATOR: And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home. After this, when

Jesus knew that all was now finished, he said (in order to fulfill the scripture),

JESUS: "I am thirsty."

A jar full of sour wine was standing there. So they put a sponge full of the wine NARRATOR:

on a branch of hyssop and held it to his mouth. When Jesus had received the

wine, he said,

JESUS: "It is finished."

NARRATOR: Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

Since it was the day of Preparation, the Jews did not want the bodies left on Silence.

the cross during the sabbath, especially because that sabbath was a day of great solemnity. So they asked Pilate to have the legs of the crucified men broken and the bodies removed. Then the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first and of the other who had been crucified with him. But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. Instead, one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once blood and water came out. (He who saw this has testified so that you also may believe. His testimony is true, and he knows that he tells the truth.) These things occurred so that the scripture might be fulfilled, "None of his bones shall be broken." And again another passage of scripture says, "They will look on the one whom they

have pierced."

After these things, Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, though a secret one because of his fear of the Jews, asked Pilate to let him take away the body of Jesus. Pilate gave him permission; so he came and removed his body. Nicodemus, who had at first come to Jesus by night, also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, weighing about a hundred pounds. They took the body of Jesus and wrapped it with the spices in linen cloths, according to the burial custom of the Jews. Now there was a garden in the place where he was crucified, and in the garden there was a new tomb in which no one had ever been laid. And so, because it was the Jewish day of Preparation, and the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.





Easter Eve The Great Easter Vigil



A Note About Tonight's Liturgy

The Great Vigil of Easter is the most symbolically beautiful and profoundly mysterious liturgy of the year. It begins in darkness –either the darkness of Saturday evening or the darkness of Easter morning before the dawn. It is tradition at the Church of the Holy Trinity to keep this vigil on Saturday evening, beginning at 8:00 pm.

You are welcome to join us on live on Facebook for this service, or you are can find your own time to worship. While there are some references to "evening" in this liturgy, you could pray this rite in the morning before the sunrise.

For this liturgy, set a large candle in the middle of your home worship space. Then, if you can, give every member of your family their own candle. These will be lighted during the first part of the worship. It is helpful to begin this liturgy truly in the dark. If you are able to shut off the lights in your home and read by candlelight, you are encouraged to do so. You may also wish to place a bowl of water in your place of worship. Even if the water is not blessed, it can still serve as a reminder of the waters of baptism.

The Lighting of the New Fire

The People gather by their place of worship in the dark, holding unlighted candles. One person lights the large candle in the worship space. In the church, the fire in the font is lit.

Leader Dear friends in Christ: On this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus passed

over from death to life, the Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which, by hearing his Word and celebrating his Sacraments, we share in his

victory over death.

Leader Let us pray.

O God, through your Son you have bestowed upon your people the brightness of your light: Sanctify this new fire, and grant that in this Paschal feast we may so burn with heavenly desires, that with pure minds we may attain to the festival of

everlasting light; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Lighting of the Paschal Candle

Handheld candles are lit or turned on. In the church, the leader carries the Paschal Candle and sings the following 3 times, with the people responding.

The Exultet

Leader Rejoice now, heavenly hosts and choirs of angels, and let your trumpets shout Salvation for the victory of our mighty King.

All you who stand near this marvelous and holy flame, pray with me to God the Almighty for the grace to sing the worthy praise of this great light; through Jesus Christ his Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Leader The Lord be with you. **People** And also with you.

Leader Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People** It is right to give him thanks and praise.

It is truly right and good, always and everywhere, with our whole heart and mind and voice, to praise you, the invisible, almighty, and eternal God, and your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the true Paschal Lamb, who at the feast of the Passover paid for us the debt of Adam's sin, and by his blood delivered your faithful people.

This is the night, when you brought our fathers, the children of Israel, out of bondage in Egypt, and led them through the Red Sea on dry land.

This is the night, when all who believe in Christ are delivered from the gloom of sin, and are restored to grace and holinessof life.

This is the night, when Christ broke the bonds of death and hell, and rose victorious from the grave.

How wonderful and beyond our knowing, O God, is your mercy and loving-kindness to us, that to redeem a slave, you gave a Son.

How holy is this night, when wickedness is put to flight, and sin is washed away. It restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to those who mourn. It casts out pride and hatred, and brings peace and concord.

How blessed is this night, when earth and heaven are joined and man is reconciled to God. Holy Father, accept our evening sacrifice, the offering of these candles in your honor. May they shine continually to drive away all darkness. May Christ, the Morning Star who knows no setting, find our faith ever burning—he who gives his light to all creation, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen**.

The First Reading

Exod. 14:10-31; 15:20-21

Reader

When Pharaoh drew near, the people of Israel lifted up their eyes, and behold, the Egyptians were marching after them; and they were in great fear. And the people of Israel cried out to the Lord; and they said to Moses, "Is it because there are no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us, in bringing us out of Egypt? Is not this what we said to you in Egypt, 'Let us alone and let us serve the Egyptians'? For it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness." And Moses said to the people, "Fear not, stand firm, and see the salvation of the Lord, which he will work for you today; for the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall never see again. The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to be still." The Lord said to Moses, "Why do you cry to me? Tell the people of Israel to go forward. Lift up your rod, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the people of Israel may go on dry ground through the sea. And I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they shall go in after them, and I will get glory over Pharaoh and all his host, his chariots, and his horsemen. And the Egyptians shall know that I am the Lord, when I have gotten glory over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his horsemen." Then the angel of God who went before the host of Israel moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud moved from before them and stood behind them, coming between the host of Egypt and the host of Israel. And there was the cloud and the darkness; and the night passed without one coming near the other all night. Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the Lord drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided. And the people of Israel went into the midst of the sea on dry ground, the waters

being a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. The Egyptians pursued, and went in after them into the midst of the sea, all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen. And in the morning watch the Lord in the pillar of fire and of cloud looked down upon the host of the Egyptians, and discomfited the host of the Egyptians, clogging their chariot wheels so that they drove heavily: and the Egyptians said, "Let us flee from before Israel; for the Lord fights for them against the Egyptians." Then the Lord said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, that the water may come back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots, and upon their horsemen." So Moses stretched forth his hand over the sea, and the sea returned to its wonted flow when the morning appeared; and the Egyptians fled into it, and the Lord routed the Egyptians in the midst of the sea. The waters returned and covered the chariots and the horsemen and all the host of Pharaoh that had followed them into the sea; not so much as one of them remained. But the people of Israel walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters being a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the hand of the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead upon the seashore. And Israel saw the great work which the Lord did against the Egyptians, and the people feared the Lord; and they believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses. Then Miriam, the prophetess, the sister of Aaron, took a timbrel in her hand; and all the women went out after her with timbrels and dancing. And Miriam sang to them: "Sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider he has thrown into the sea."
